It has still been challenging to provide the outcomes and supports to our Veteran Community that your Committee would hope to be able to provide with the pandemic still bubbling along. Despite the current issues that we all face, the Committee has still been able to keep things moving forward.

In March we were able to hold the Annual General Meeting at the Ocean Grove Bowling Club with a reasonable turnout. It was good to be able to provide an update on how the Ocean Grove Barwon Heads RSL Sub Branch is going and to conduct the Committee Elections. Not much of a change in the Committee this year, just a shuffling of the deck with some positional changes.

It was great to be able to provide the opportunity for our community to support this years ANZAC Appeal with our selling points prior to ANZAC Day. Unfortunately, we were unable to provide our normal service in Barwon Heads, due to the restrictions placed upon us by the State Government to run the service in Hitchcock Avenue. The Dawn Service, March and Main Service in Ocean Grove were well supported and the number of attendees matched our required limit of 1000 per event. Thanks to all who supported the organizing, setup, running and pack up of the events. We would not have been able to run these events without the support of our volunteers who provided the mandatory COVID 19 registrations at all of the events.

The Vietnam Veterans Day will be commemorated this year by our RSL on Wednesday 18 August 2021 with a Wreath Laying at the Ocean Grove Memorial, followed by a get together at 3.30pm at the Ocean Grove Bowling Club.

ANZAC Appeals Results

The COVID-19 restrictions imposed last year meant that we did not take part in the 2020 ANZAC Appeal.

However, this year we were back in the game with a new collection point at the Kingston Village shopping centre. Of course, this meant we had to forgo collecting at one of the traditional sites, because there were not enough volunteers to man five collection points. Under these circumstances, the Committee decided the best site to close was that which was usually situated outside Liquorland in the Ocean Grove shopping centre.

This year also saw the advent of electronic funds transfer (EFT) terminals at each of our collection sites and this proved to be a positive initiative.

Overall the appeal raised \$24,114; \$18,085 in cash and \$6,029 by EFT.

This result was considered most satisfactory and saw \$12,050 credited to our welfare funds in the Agency account.

FEEDBACK FROM THE OCEAN GROVE RSL COMMITTEE REGARDING VETERAN SUICIDE

Following an initial meeting with Ms Libby Crocker a group from the OG RSL met on Monday 10 May 2021 to consider causes and actions to address the high rate of Veteran suicide. The group represented Veterans from the Vietnam era up to and including currently serving members. All three Services were represented and encompassed extensive Operational and Eligible Service.

The group captured our individual and group thoughts on what contributes to and/or causes states of mind and emotions that may lead a veteran to suicide. We believe the issue is complex. However, we are convinced there are actions that can be taken to assist Veterans whilst serving and post discharge to better deal with the stresses and strains of Service life and which may ultimately save Veteran lives.

Space unfortunately does not allow for all the thoughts and suggestions to be displayed, here but the two main Causes identified were <u>The difficulties of Service life</u> were clearly evident and the <u>Lack of preparation for transition to civilian life</u>. Solutions/Actions

- More and better de briefs post Military activities both operational and non-operational including psych support as necessary
- Supported/targeted Veteran employment post discharge
- More preparation for transition back into civilian life prior to and post discharge: obligatory (must attend) briefing and training sessions for both long term and short term service members, ongoing mentoring available post discharge,
- Defence take a much higher involvement with Transition
- Psych assessment prior to discharge (as is done pre-enlistment), done as part of discharge medical with a particular emphasis on being deemed 'fit/not fit for discharge
- Lots more paid Advocates with expanded roles beyond Pension and Entitlement matters (perhaps link with Mentoring?)
- Better links to support services (RSL and other ESO's) pre and post discharge
- Improve image of support services
- Explore the possibility of a notice being sent the local RSL or local support body when the individual is or has been discharged so that we can make the approach/ introduction to them (currently we expect them to come to us)
- Reduce DVA bureaucracy/Gold card for all Veterans

DVA News

MyAccount will be turned off

Over the past few months, we have been increasing the services you can access on MyService. MyService will soon be your one-stop access point for all your DVA online services.

As part of this change MyAccount will be turned off in the coming months.

If you're a MyAccount holder and have correspondence in your inbox that you want to keep, you'll need to save it to where you store your electronic files. To help you do this, we've provided instructions on the <u>DVA website</u>.

Claim travel expenses' function improved on MyService

DVA is continuing to improve MyService. The need for simpler, better, and more accessible online services has never been more important and your feedback on our services is central to helping us deliver better services for you. Veterans and the veteran community have provided substantial feedback on the new *Claim travel expenses* functionality in MyService over the last few months. Based on your feedback, we've made several improvements, which are available in MyService now. More improvements are coming in the next few months.

Improvements to MyService Claim travel expenses from 3 July:

Addition of a comment box in the claim process. This feature was available in MyAccount and has now been reinstated in MyService. You can use this box to add any supporting information that's important for your claim.

Addition of missing Tolls information. Depending on the Act your condition has been approved under, you may not be able to claim road tolls as an expense. MyService now includes a message to tell you if you're unable to claim.

Revised 'New Provider' design. In the initial MyService design, there wasn't a clear link to where to add the details of a new provider. The design has been improved to make it easier for you to enter new provider details.

Revised 'Use Previous' design. This feature has been improved so that you can easily add multiple expenses for the same provider in the same claim. All the providers you enter for all your claims are saved for your future claims.

Inquiry into unit recognition for ADF service in Somalia

Call for submissions

The Defence Honours and Awards Appeals Tribunal has been directed to inquire into and report on recognition for Australian Defence Force units that served in Somalia between 1992 and 1995.

In particular, the Tribunal is to examine relevant evidence and consider whether it is appropriate that any Australian units that served in Somalia between 1992 and 1995 be awarded a Meritorious Unit Citation, or another form of further recognition for service.

In doing so, the Tribunal is to have regard to the eligibility criteria for the Meritorious Unit Citation, as set out in the Unit Citations Regulations, or other relevant Regulations.

The Tribunal is to report, in writing, to the Minister for Defence Personnel on the findings and recommendations that arise from the inquiry.

Submissions to the Tribunal close on 31 August 2021, and can be lodged online through the Tribunal's website. More information about making a submission can be found at <u>www.defence-honours-tribunal.gov.au</u>.
